


# WEEKLY MARKET UPDATE

Bulk butter remains tight as the holidays approach, driving prices last week above the \$3.50-per-pound mark and to another all-time record high.

- Even before recent leaps, US butter prices were uncompetitive internationally, hurting export opportunities. August outbound butter volume totaled 5.2 million pounds, down 62.9% (-8.8 million pounds) on the year.
- US consumers continue to buy butter, with January-through-August usage up 8.2% versus 2022.
- With plenty of cheddar around, spot blocks continued to slip lower, though barrels jumped higher.
- Cheese exports continued to lag prior-year levels in August, totaling 82.1 million pounds, down 3.0% (-2.5 million pounds) on the year. Mexico remained the primary buyer.
- Shoppers are picking up fewer slices and shreds. Year-to-date through August, US

- cheese consumption was just 0.6% above prior-year levels.
- The latest GlobalDairyTrade event saw prices climb higher across the board. SMP jumped
   6.6% to \$1.16 per pound and WMP rose 4.7% to \$1.33 per pound.
- But the price increases in New Zealand didn't carry over to Chicago, where spot NDM slipped on the week.
- US NDM sales reached 150.5 million pounds in August, up 4.2% (+6.1 million pounds) on the year thanks to strong interest from Mexico.
- According to the latest Dairy Products report, production was down seasonally across the board. While cheese output slipped at a slower-than-average pace, butter and NDM production declined faster than normal.
