#### **WHO**

Test if you have red or swollen eyes, cough, fever, body aches, or are otherwise feeling unwell. These symptoms could be COVID-19 or the flu. If you or someone in your home has COVID-19, the flu, or bird flu, medicine is available to help prevent serious illness.

You may be at risk of bird flu if you:

- · work with infected animals such as cows or poultry,
- · handle or drink raw milk,
- or have sick backyard chickens.

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# WEEKLY MARKET UPDATE

The CME butter market had its busiest trading week since August. For February 10-14, 51 lots changed hands — 31 on February 12 alone. On the price side, spot butter keeps testing new lows, then rebounding. After slipping below \$2.40, the market climbed back above the mark.

- After weeks of roller coaster rides, the CME cheese market has been relatively quiet in recent days. Supply and demand seem balanced for now, with blocks comfortable in the low-\$1.90s and barrels in the low-\$1.80s. Analysts continue to watch the balance of new plant start-ups versus milk production and trade news.
- Like spot cheese, Class III futures have tightened into a narrower trading range, just above the \$19-per-hundredweight mark. But declines in butter have helped send Class IV contracts tumbling so second quarter futures are roughly on par with Class III.
- Milk powder prices declined at this week's GlobalDairyTrade auction, with skim milk

powder shedding 2.9% to close at \$1.25 per pound. Whole milk powder declined just 0.4% to \$1.88 per pound. Cheddar also dropped, down 3.2% to \$2.21, while butter rose 2.2% to \$3.35 per pound.

- Soft demand and lower global prices are still weighing on the US nonfat dry milk market, driving prices lower. Spot prices slipped below the \$1.30-per-pound mark for the first time since August.
- Decent demand is driving US corn prices higher. March corn leapt up and passed the \$5-per-pound mark with reports of strong export business. Soybean markets were choppier, but weaker, with March futures moving into the \$10.30s.
